Canon Lynda Barley leads our morning worship at the start of a New Year. Contact details are as for December 27th.


Sunday 10th January at 11.00 a.m. – Holy Communion in the Parish Church

Subject to any possible lockdown restrictions, our weekly Sunday worship will resume in the Parish Church until Easter. During this period, two Zoom services are planned – for 7th February and 7th March.

Could I remind everyone coming to a ‘live’ service:

- Please bring your face covering and some hand sanitiser for use before and after Communion
- Please arrive in good time so that we can all be seated safely before we begin
- If you make your offerings via the collection plate, please do so if possible before the service as you arrive at Church to avoid queueing at the end
- Please remain in your seats at the end of the service until invited to leave by a steward and continue to observe the 2 metre social distancing both inside and outside the Church.

GASDS – (Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme)



For those of you who make your regular offering through the collection plate, a reminder that it is **no longer necessary to use a Gift Aid envelope for the Church to reclaim tax on your offering.** Any cash donation of up to £30 made at an act of worship will automatically attract 25% tax relief under the Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme (as will contactless payments of up to £30 when we are able to process them!) In practice, you do not need to use a Gift Aid envelope unless you are paying by cheque or using a £50 note. We hope that this may speed up the process for making donations to the collection before and especially after services. Donations at other times should continue to be via the Gift Aid envelopes if you are an Income Tax payer.
